COLLABORATION - A KEY TO SUCCESS IN OUR COMMUNITY

Over the past twelve months, the Ashland County Community Foundation has been extremely active in fostering relationships with existing community partners, but in new and exciting ways:



United Way of Ashland County

Ev DeVaul, director of the local United Way, is known, far and wide, as a dynamic leader. In fact, with the recent accomplishment of meeting its 8th consecutive annual fundraising goal, the United Way of Ashland County was recognized as the United Way of the Year in the entire State of Ohio. ACCF's Board of Directors recently acknowledged this achievement by adding \$5,000 to UWAC's "J. Robert Tipton Endowment Fund", which provides annual distributions for ongoing support of this fine organization. This one-time celebratory grant is in keeping with ACCF's mission of encouraging sustainability for its nonprofit agency partners. UWAC is currently engaged in its "A Legacy of Caring Initiative" to promote the concept of creating endowment, through planned giving, to provide long-term support of its efforts to better our community. ACCF is pleased to partner with UWAC in this effort.

Hospice of North Central Ohio

Ralph Tomassi, former ACCF founding board member, recently retired from his long-time position as a development officer at Ashland University and began assisting Linda Hickey and the staff at Hospice-NCO with its efforts to expand its donor base and encourage the establishment of endowment for future operational support. Ralph and ACCF Executive Director, Jim Cutright,

friends and associates for many years, have been working closely to enhance the relationship of the two organizations. In this particular instance, Hospice-NCO receives many one-time memorial gifts, but recognizes that long-term funding is best served through the building of endowment funds that can be pooled with other such investments, under the stewardship of ACCF. Named endowment funds may, likewise, be established as a memorial to a loved one; a gift that is made once, but keeps on giving. Hospice-NCO may also be named in an individual's estate planning.

Ashland Area Chamber of Commerce/Leadership Ashland

Barbie Lange, the director of AACC, has continually improved upon the offerings of our local chamber, in support of local businesses. Among its many initiatives, Leadership Ashland stands out as one of the "jewels". This past year, ACCF enhanced its relationship with the Chamber, by increasing its membership level to that of "Sustainer", with its entire dues structure being directed to support this important leadership development program. The Foundation believes that it is especially important to provide our nonprofit agency partners with the opportunity to take advantage of this program, and so is offering one fully-paid tuition "scholarship" each year, for a staff member, with preference given to agencies with which ACCF has an endowment relationship.

Ashland County Park District, et al

The recent announcement of an "inclusive" playground project, to be built on Dale Roy School property is the epitome of community collaboration. In addition to the school, partners with two ACCF anonymous donors include the Ashland County Park District, the Samaritan Hospital Foundation, Snyder's-Lance, Inc., Fin Feather Fur Outfitters, Dr. Stan and Mrs. Diana Brechbuhler, Robert and Judith DeSanto, Brian and Karen Kellogg and many others. What started as a dream became a reality through the generous joining-of-hands of many in our community. As we like to say, "Ordinary People Doing *Extraordinary* Things!" Community foundations were created to match people who care with causes that matter, through the pooling of resources. This is an amazing example of that type of teamwork.

FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR (CUTTY'S CORNER)

Amazingly, three years have gone by since I stepped into some pretty big shoes here at the Foundation; that of succeeding the venerable Dr. Lucille Ford, as the visible leader of this organization.

It's very fitting that she recently served as the "Grand Marshal" of the City of Ashland's Bicentennial festivities which occurred over the Fourth of July weekend. "Grand" certainly describes her... "impressive, majestic, noble, dignified". A "Marshal" is one who "arranges things in an orderly fashion". Sound like anyone we know...*and love?! It is her leadership that has become the "foundation" upon which we continue to build, and I will always be tremendously grateful for her support and mentorship, as I assumed this role.*

In the past three years, a remarkable 82 new endowment funds have been created at ACCF, bringing our total to 328, and emphasizing the fact that people of generous intent are, more and more, recognizing the community foundation model as one that effectively and efficiently helps them meet their philanthropic goals.

My objective has been, as I have often stated, to emphasize the "community" in our community foundation. The concept is that people of any means, across a broad spectrum, can participate

in making an impact in Ashland County. This fact is particularly evident in the past twelve months, as ACCF has received individual gifts ranging from \$2 to \$1,000,000. Now, that's about as broad as you can get!

2015 officially marks our 20th year of existence. In that time, we have accumulated over \$32 million in assets, engaged over 6,200 individual donors and re-invested over \$8 million back into Ashland County through scholarships and grants of many different types.

On the evening of November 4th, we will acknowledge our appreciation of our kind donors that have made this sort of impact possible. Our good friend and benefactor, Matt Underwood, will be a featured speaker that evening. Past trustees will also be honored; those upon whose shoulders we now stand. We hope that many of you will choose to join the celebration. If you'd like more information, please feel free to contact our office.

Innovation Fund

The largest gift received this past year, and among the largest ever received at ACCF, was from a donor who wishes to remain anonymous. A remarkable act of generosity, with the intent of reinvestment in our community, in the form of a new \$1 million gift, was made in December 2014. A glorious day, indeed, for ACCF! This donor's naming it the "Innovation Fund" alludes to the creativity and desire to make an impact in the Ashland County community that is behind this gift. Needs in areas like economic development, job skills training, career development support, technical education and community progress initiatives are all on the donor's radar screen, as brainstorming continues. The donor also is hoping that this fund will inspire other community leaders, who are in a position to do so, to consider similar gifting to ACCF for the building of sustainability through endowment.

Going forward, the Ashland County Community Foundation will continue to explore opportunities, as they are presented, to advance its mission. The board and staff view the development of these relationships as complimentary, not competitive. Nonprofit organizations which don't collaborate will eventually...stagnate. 

DR. LUCILLE G. FORD "FREEDOM FROM SELFISHNESS" AWARD



Nancy T. Davis was named the inaugural recipient of the "Freedom from Selfishness" Award, created and named in honor of Dr. Lucille G. Ford, the Community Foundation's founding president.

"I was so surprised, so amazed and so grateful to be the first woman chosen to receive this prestigious award named in honor of my dear friend and our ACCF founder, Dr. Lucille Ford," Davis stated. "This (award) is a tribute to all women who work hard in their own situations; it is the spirit of love that carries them," she said. "Love asks for nothing and is fulfilled in itself."

Davis has been involved in numerous organizations throughout the years, including the Salvation Army Kroc Center, Ashland County Historical Society, Trinity Lutheran Church, YMCA, Ashland City Schools, Ashland Symphony Orchestra, First United Methodist Church, Samaritan Regional Health System Foundation, and 20 years with the Community Foundation.

The Dr. Lucille G. Ford "Freedom from Selfishness" Award was created in 2013 by the ACCF's Women's Fund. Recognizing and honoring Dr. Ford, who defines philanthropy as "freedom from selfishness," this award recognizes Ashland County women who demonstrate a long-standing commitment to philanthropy.
